# The Waves of Grief

The wave that towered over the storm-tossed boat was like a dark wall of doom as it seemed to hover momentarily before smashing the vessel with startling ferocity. The wave slapped the stunned sailor into the churning ocean where she was pushed down into the cold darkness. Holding her breath, she felt her body sink into the roiling blackness until the sound of the pounding storm above was a muffled roar.

She came to rest in the dark depths of an unknown place, her knees and hands touching the bottom of a muddy morass. How long could she hold her breath down here? Would she ever


find her way back to her boat? Fear and despair gripped her heart as she weighed the options: give up and stay here until she ran out of breath or try to return to the surface of that hostile ocean.

Her fingers closed on a small round object imbedded in the mud and she was compelled to clutch it tightly. At the same moment, she felt herself naturally floating upwards. She gasped for air as her head breached the surface of the water. The storm had abated. Her boat was no where to be seen, but to her surprise, she saw a nearby rocky shoreline. She desperately swam towards the land, her lungs burning with exertion. She eventually staggered onto land but was dismayed to discover that it was a barren desert, seemingly bereft of life. How was she going to survive here?

The analogy of grief being like a stormy ocean that one is tossed in, powerless to control the elemental impacts of nature, is one that resonates with many people who have had a loved one die. They feel overwhelmed and at the mercy of something so menacing, so powerful and so mysterious.

And once a wave of grief crashes over them and pushes them deep into the water, they wonder if they'll ever resurface. But the lone sailor in this story remembers finding a small round object at the bottom of the sea which she still clutches in her hand. In her palm sits a bright green seed which she can now plant in the new landscape of her life.

The waves of grief that repeatedly overcome her also take her to places deep within herself that she must visit, for only there can she find what she needs to bring to the surface and reconcile the reality of her loss. At times she goes so deep and it is so dark that she wonders if she'll ever survive. But each time, the natural process of healing has her float back to the surface.





And even now, she can choose to hide in a crevice in the rocks and not explore the new world that grief has thrown her into, or she can begin exploring one area at a time, mapping each section until she knows where the sources of water and refuge are, which areas hold benefits and which are not helpful to her adjustment. And in these wanderings, there are no mistakes, just learnings.

She learns to trust the storm and allow the waves to do their work. Over time, the gaps between the waves get longer, the depths she's pushed to are not as deep and the length of time she stays beneath the water's surface gets shorter. One day, she will find a garden growing from the seeds she brings to her new world. It won't be the same as the former garden she loved and tended so preciously, but it will be nurturing and beautiful in a new way.

# **Cheddar Cheeseburger Meatloaf**

## **Ingredients:**

#### **MEATLOAF**

1/4 cup plain breadcrumbs
1 tsp smoked paprika
1/2 tsp garlic powder
3/4 tsp salt
1 large egg
1/2 cup minced onion
4 oz. sharp cheddar
1 lb. ground beef (85/15)

#### **GLAZE**


1/2 cup ketchup1 Tbsp brown sugar1 tsp yellow mustard1 tsp Worcestershire sauce



#### **Directions:**

- Preheat the oven to 350°F. In a small bowl stir together the breadcrumbs, smoked paprika, garlic powder, and salt. In a separate small bowl, lightly whisk the egg.
- 2. Finely mince the onion. Roughly chop the cheddar cheese so that it is in pieces about the same size as a small bean.
- 3. Add the ground beef, seasoned breadcrumbs, whisked egg, minced onion, and chopped cheddar to a bowl.

  Use your hands to mix the ingredients together until incorporated.



- 5. To make the glaze, stir together the ketchup, brown sugar, mustard, and Worcestershire sauce. Spread the glaze over the unbaked meatloaf.
- 6. Bake the meatloaf in the preheated oven for 50-55 minutes, or until the internal temperature reaches 160°F. Remove the meatloaf from the oven, let it sit for 5-10 minutes, then slice into eight pieces and serve.

# **Programs & Services Update**



We held our *Children's Grief Support Camp* on May 6 & 7. There were 13 kids who attended because they are grieving the death of a loved one. They left our camp with strategies to cope with their grief, a new understanding and acceptance of their thoughts and feelings, and most importantly, new friends who are going through a similar experience.

We had a great turnout at our *Dying to Learn More: Aging Mindfully* presentation on Wednesday, May 25th. Fraser Health informed us on Advance Care Planning and Dr. Gordon Wallace taught us how to embrace aging mindfully using Mindfulness Meditation. Along with these presentations, participants were treated to a free lunch and had access to various community resources including Brella Society, CARP, Dignity Memorial—Victory Memorial Park Funeral Centre, Peace Arch Hospice Society, and Retirement Concepts.

Thank you to Sovereign Order of St. John Jerusalem and Surrey Cares for providing us with a grant that allowed us to host this event and upcoming Dying to Learn More presentations to our community, free of charge.





Our *Good Grief Teen Training Program* ran from March 30 - May 4. This unique program for grade 11 & 12 students teaches teens how to support a grieving friend, what to say and not to say, and how to talk about difficult subjects. After completing the program, participants have the opportunity to volunteer for our organization and receive a certificate for their resume.

Some of our recent graduates generously volunteered their time at our Hike for Hospice fundraiser as Route Marshals.
